




# **SYNOPSIS:**

## THE MAKING OF MAD AS HELL

I'm originally from Wisconsin and filmmaking has always been my main passion. In 2008, I was attending UW-Madison but wasn't feeling very fulfilled in what I wanted to achieve film-wise. I left school, packed up my car and drove to Los Angeles. Once there, I had to accomplish two things: make a living to be able to stay in LA, and find a way to get back in my parents' good graces after dropping out of college.

My dad and brother were both big fans of an online news show called "The Young Turks" featuring this bombastic host named Cenk Uygur. When I found out the show was based in LA, I sought out an intership with TYT, and was eventually hired full-time. However, I was out in LA to make movies, not necessarily to work at an internet news show. But Cenk was such a compelling and larger than life character that at the end of my first week there I asked him what he would think about me making a documentary on him and TYT. Cenk exclaimed, "I've always wanted a documentary about me!" giving his approval for me to start filming on my own as long as it didn't interfere with my work.

I was filming constantly but did not know how the documentary would be shaped. Some of the people working at TYT thought nothing would ever come of it. First it became a running joke in the office, and then people forgot I was even working on it. For me, things became more compelling as TYT continued to grow on YouTube and gain its large fan base, but it wasn't until Cenk got pulled from the 6pm timeslot at MSNBC that I knew had a film on my hands.

In 2013, a short film I produced called CURFEW won the Academy Award for Best Short Film, Live Action, which was an incredible experience. Inspired, I left my employment with The Young Turks to make filmmaking my full-time job, working on many feature films in various roles. But even after leaving TYT I kept coming back to film MAD AS HELL as the story was still unfolding.

It was important to me to maintain creative of the film after I left the company. I wanted to portray Cenk, TYT, and the story the way I saw and experienced it, no strings attached. Maybe because TYT never thought the film would be finished, or maybe because that is just their style, I received both final cut and business control of the documentary. I was happy that I could make the film my way, but needed support to finish it. After raising financing from both an Indiegogo campaign and private investors, I was able to complete the film in 2014, making it a five year total endeavor. Cenk cringes at some moments in the documentary, but he understands the importance of being able to say what you want, your way; and after all, that is what his story and this film is all about.

Andrew Napier was born and raised in Wisconsin and attended the University of Wisconsin - Madison. In 2009, after working on Quentin Tarantino's "Inglourious Basterds" in Berlin, Germany, he moved to Los Angeles. Andrew was a producer of the 2013 Academy Award®- winning short film "Curfew," and later edited its feature adaptation "Before I Disappear" (SXSW 2014 Audience Award Winner). His screenplay for "Dogtooth," a remake of the Academy Award®-nominated Greek foreign film, is currently in development at Mandalay Pictures. Andrew directed the feature documentary "Mad As Hell" (Hot Docs

2014 Conscious Media Award Winner), which follows Cenk Uygur, who's online news show "The Young Turks" has amassed over two billion views on YouTube. He also directed the narrative short "Grandma's Not A Toaster" (Tribeca 2013) and the feature documentary "Mary and Bill" (Wisconsin Film Festival 2011 Best Documentary). Andrew produced and edited the documentaries "The Past is a Grotesque Animal" (2014), about the band "of Montreal," released by Oscilloscope Laboratories, and "Bounce: How the Ball Taught the World to Play." Andrew co-produced the romantic comedy "Lust For Love" (2014), starring Fran Kranz and Dichen Lachman. He served as an executive producer for the documentary "The Culture High," and the dark comedies "The Lord of Catan" starring Amy Acker, and "Limbo" starring H. Jon Benjamin.


